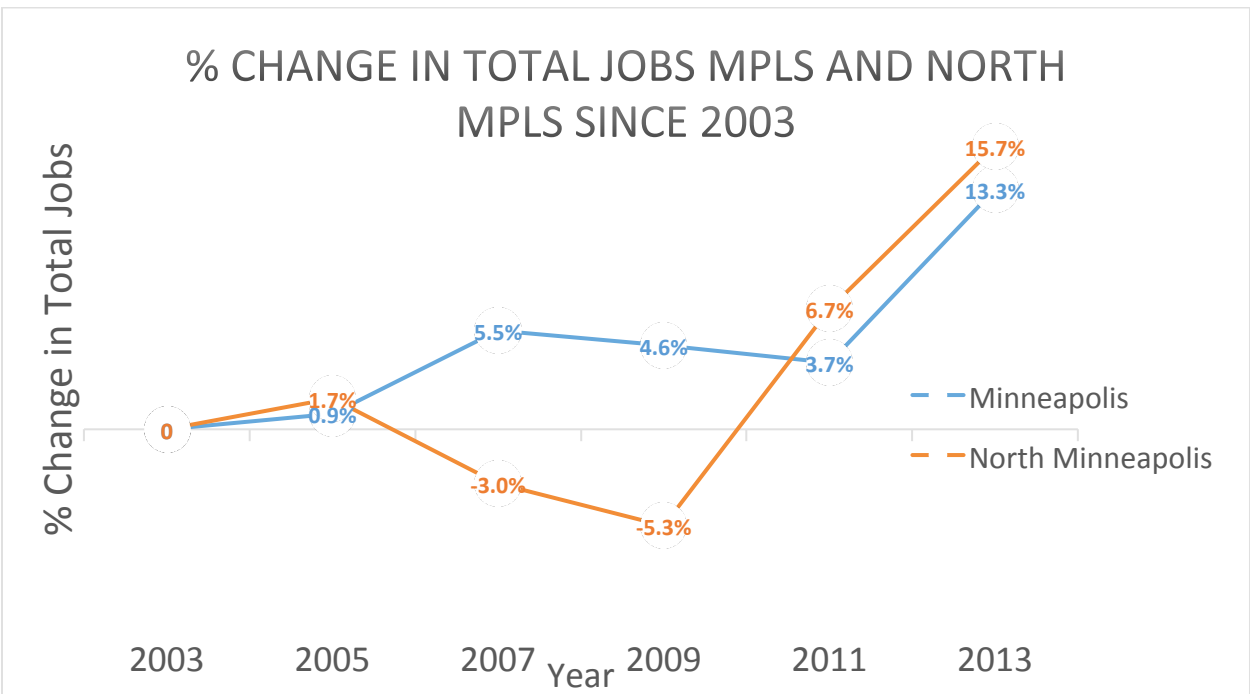

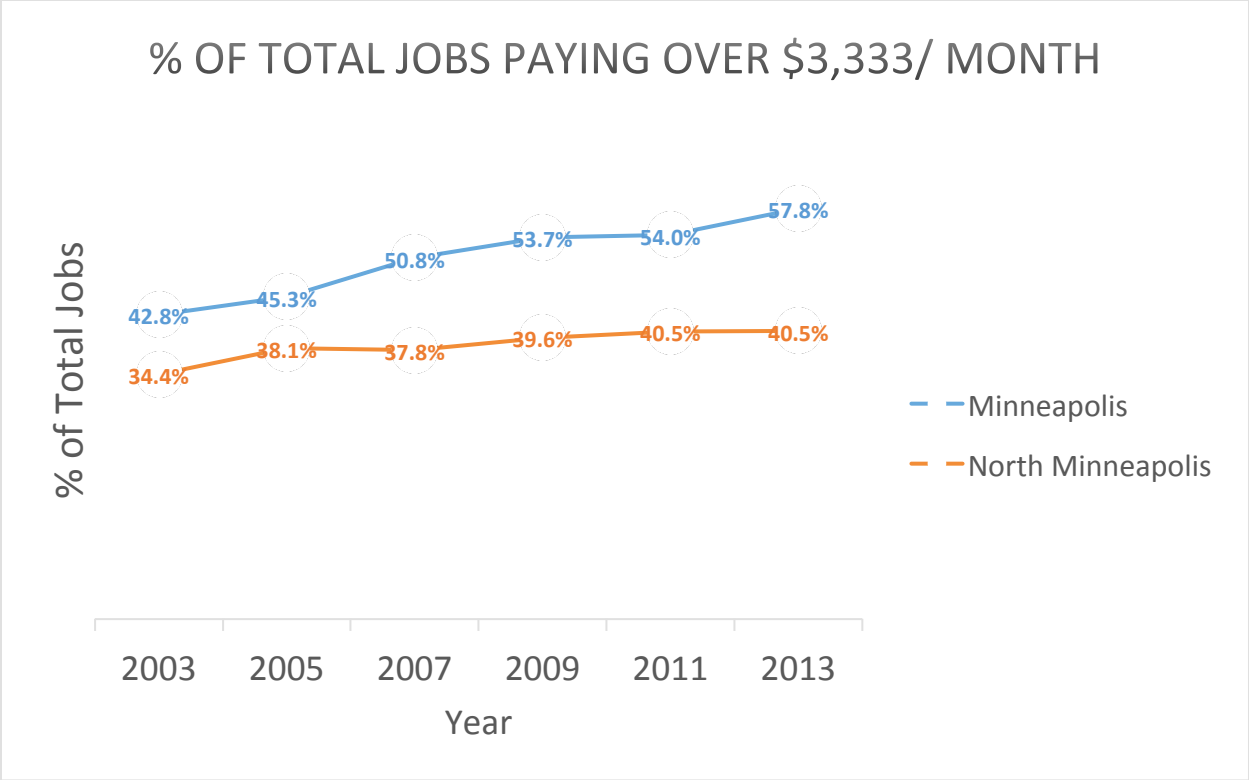


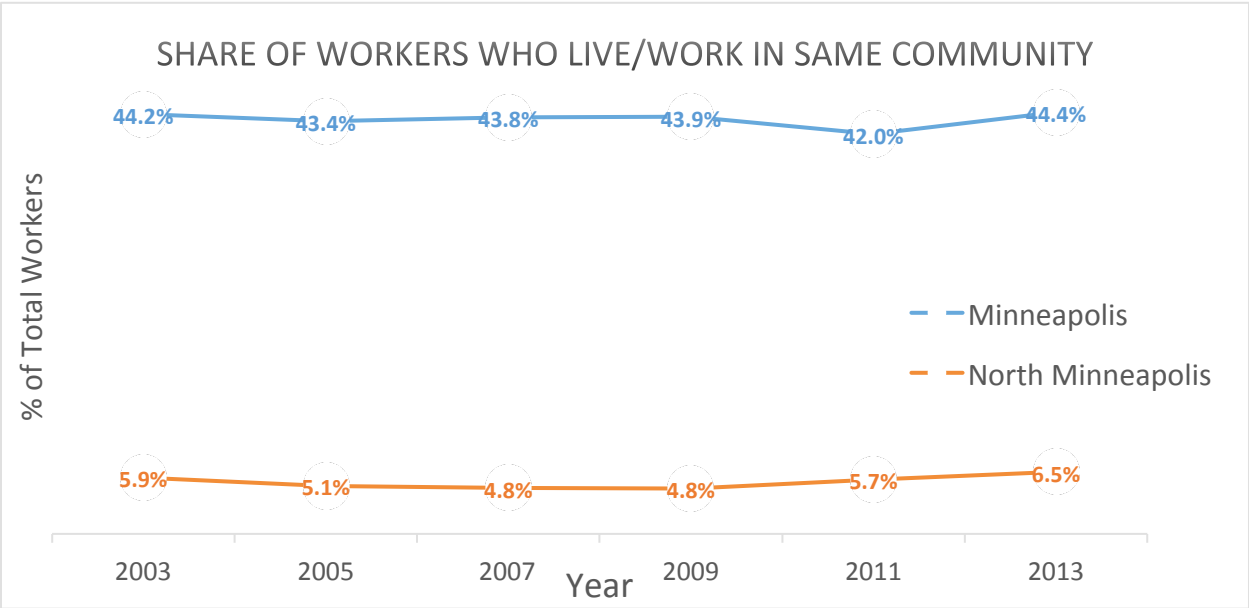
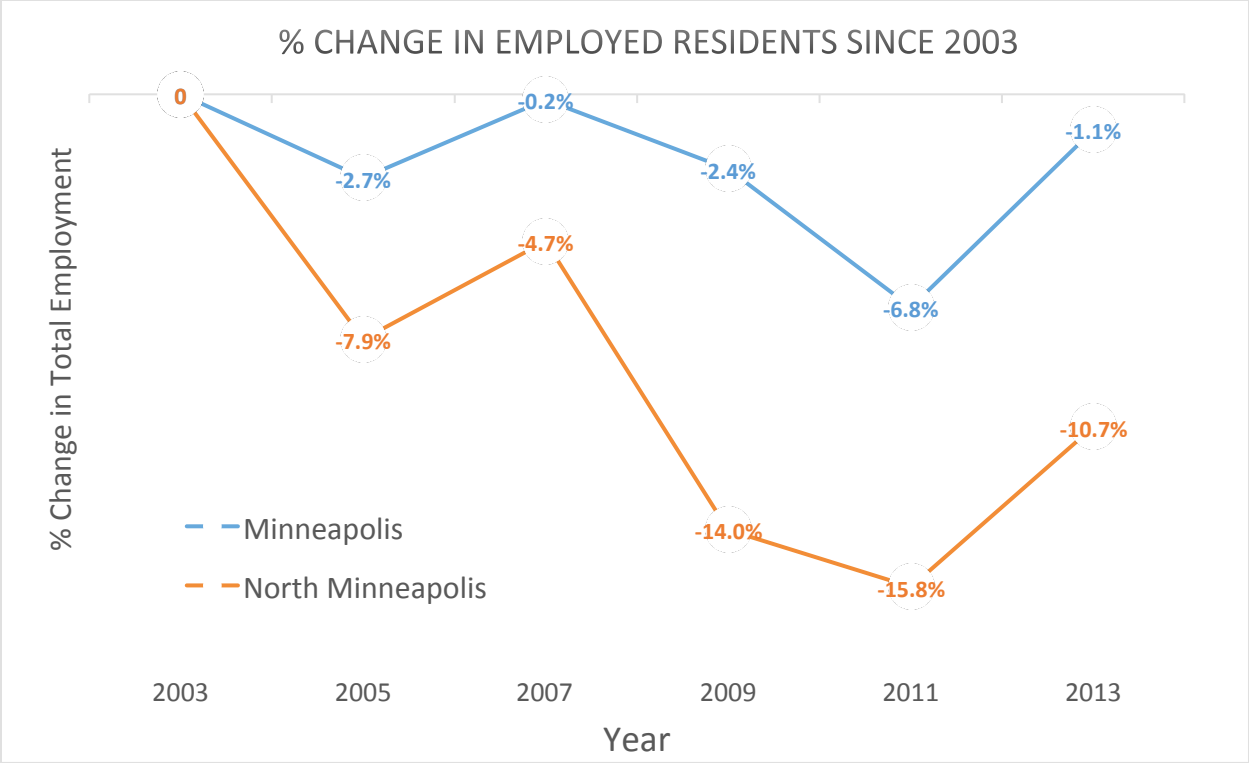
NORTH MINNEAPOLIS UNEMPLOYMENT RATE BY RACE/ETHNICITY



Employment & Jobs – Local Employment and Household Dynamics (US Census)



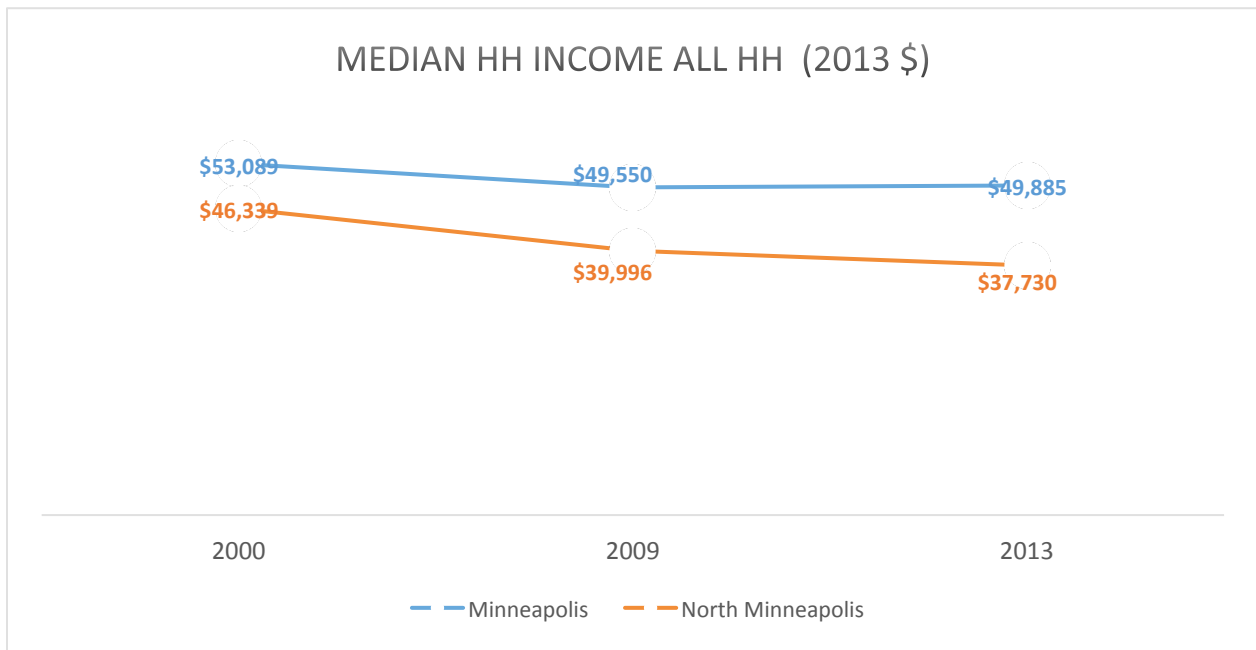


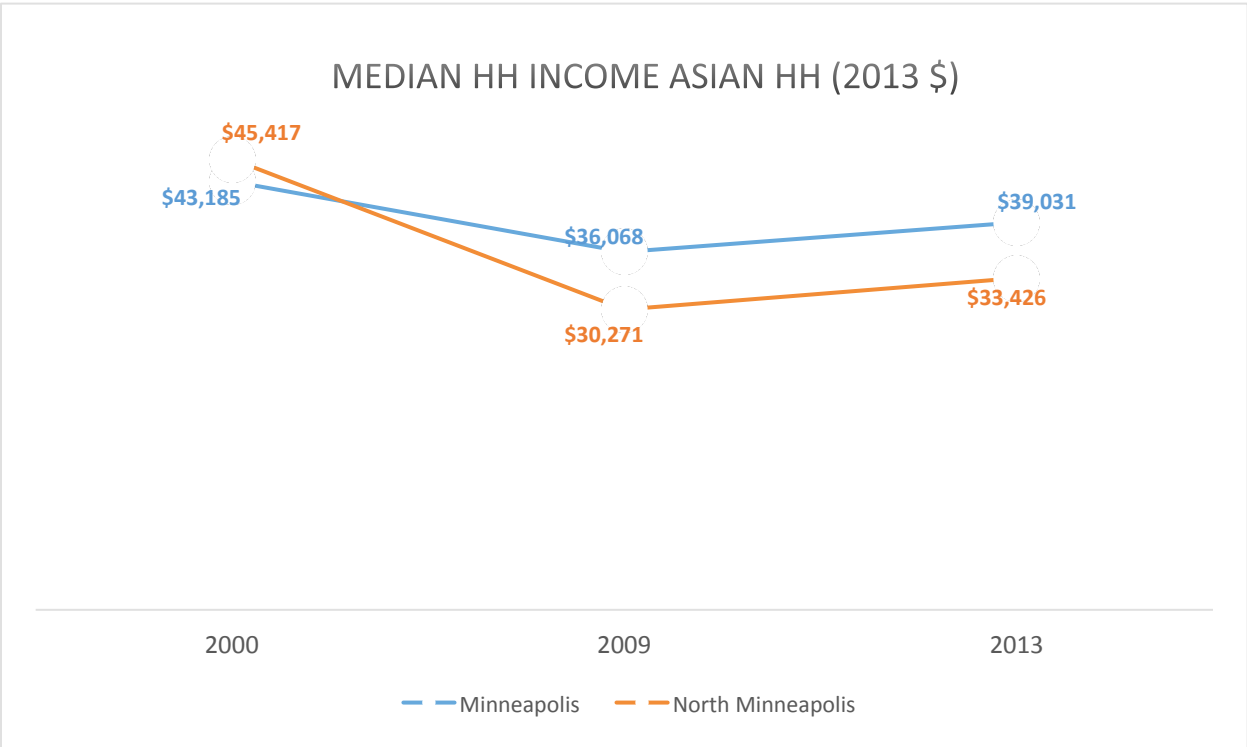

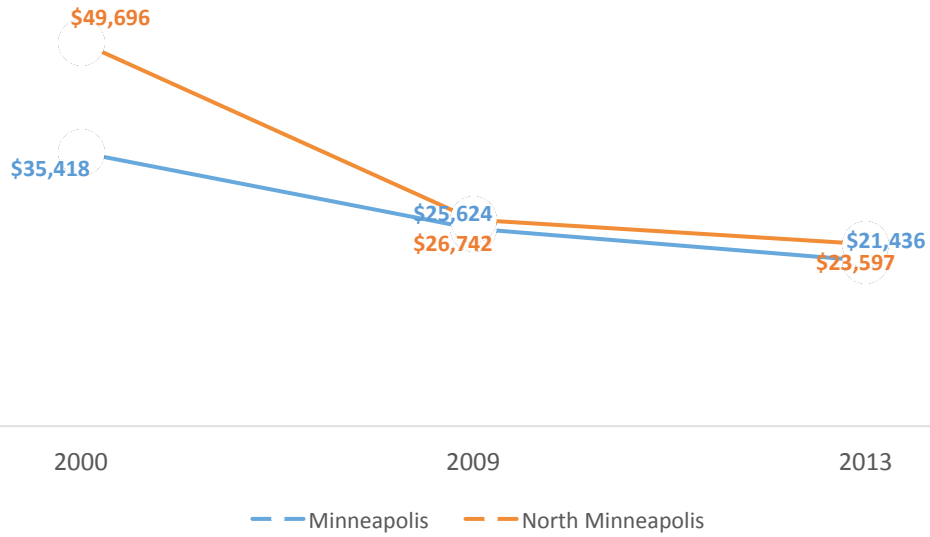
- NMPLS Lost about 3,500 employed persons since 2003 due to job loss and employed residents leaving the Northside.
- Gap in higher wage jobs between MPLS and North
- Jobs have rebounded but employment hasn't. More new jobs on the Northside, but largely are not going toward current residents.
- Share of residents who live and work in NMPLS has been fairly steady since 2003.

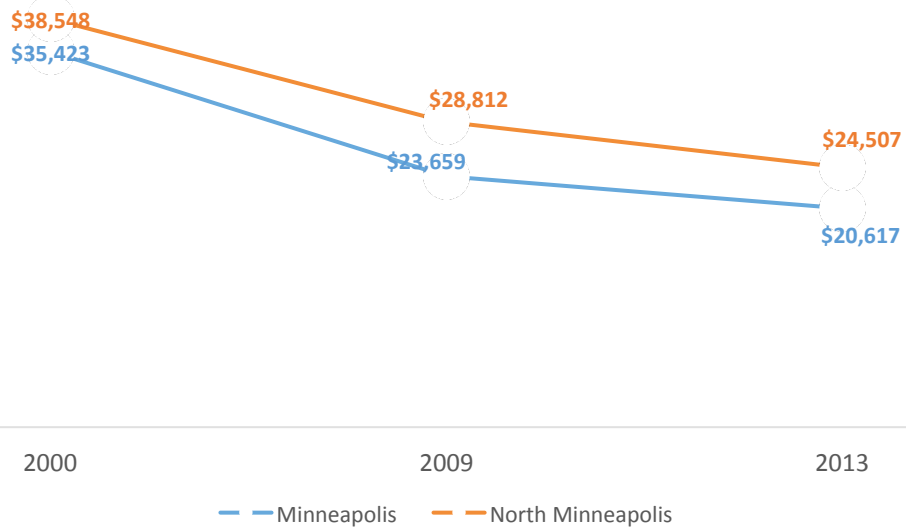


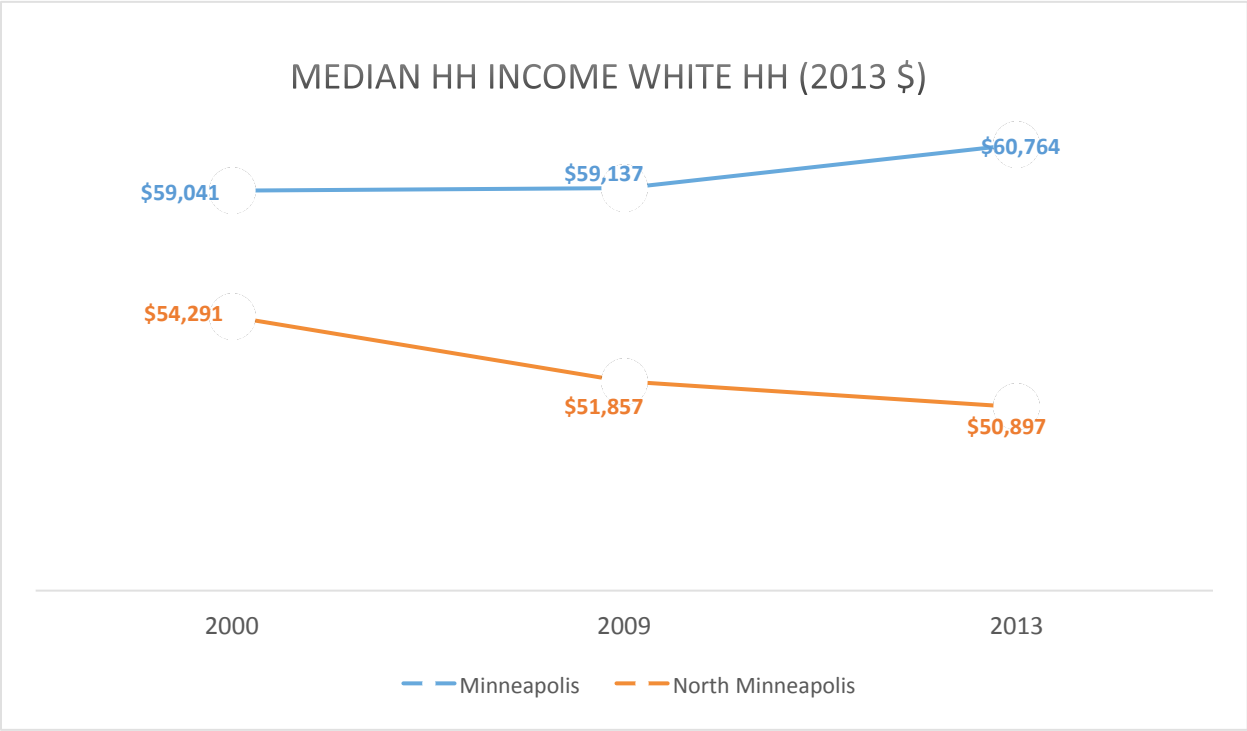
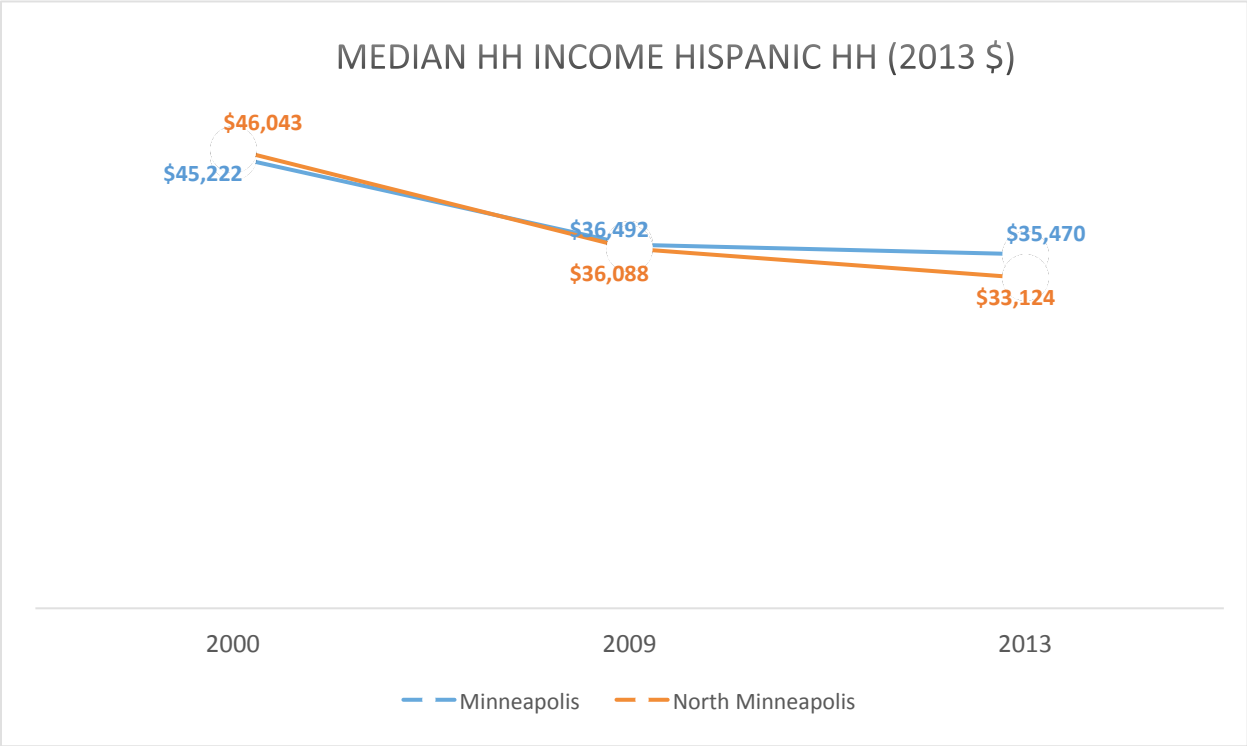


MEDIAN HH INCOME AMERICAN INDIAN HH (2013 \$)

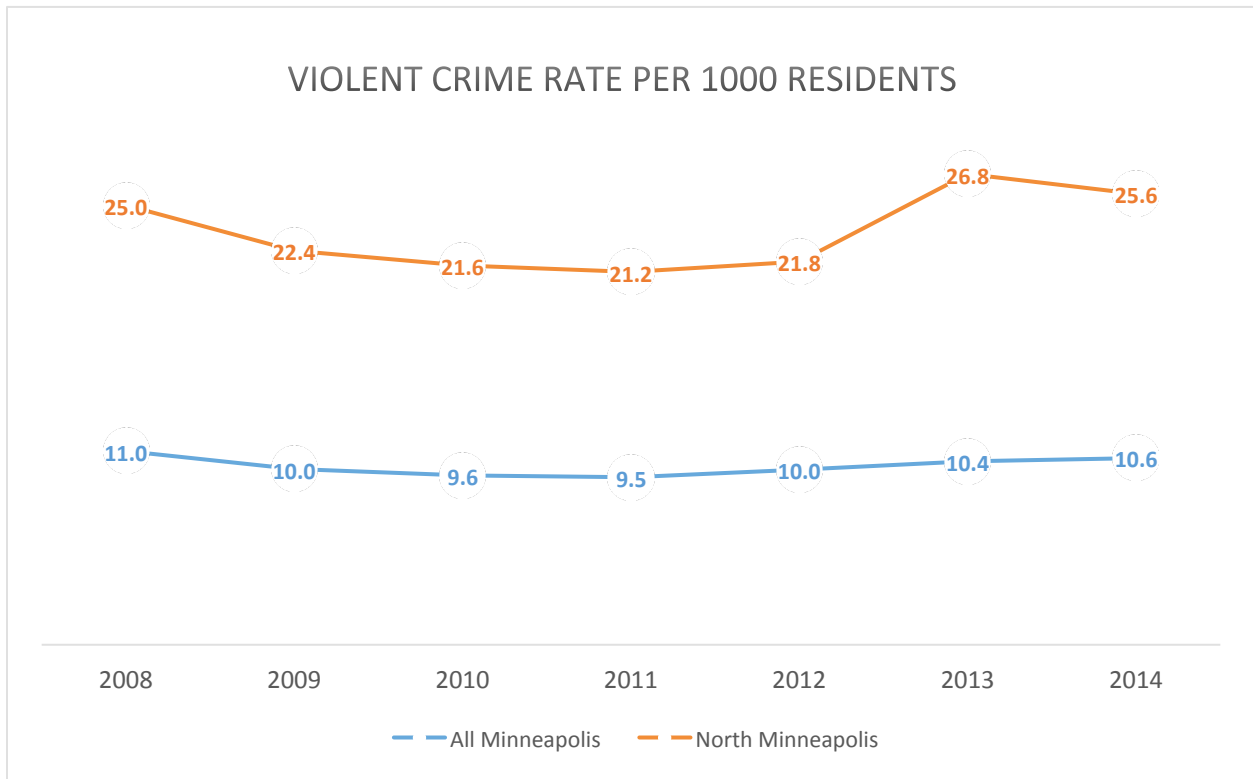


MEDIAN HH INCOME BLACK HH (2013 \$)

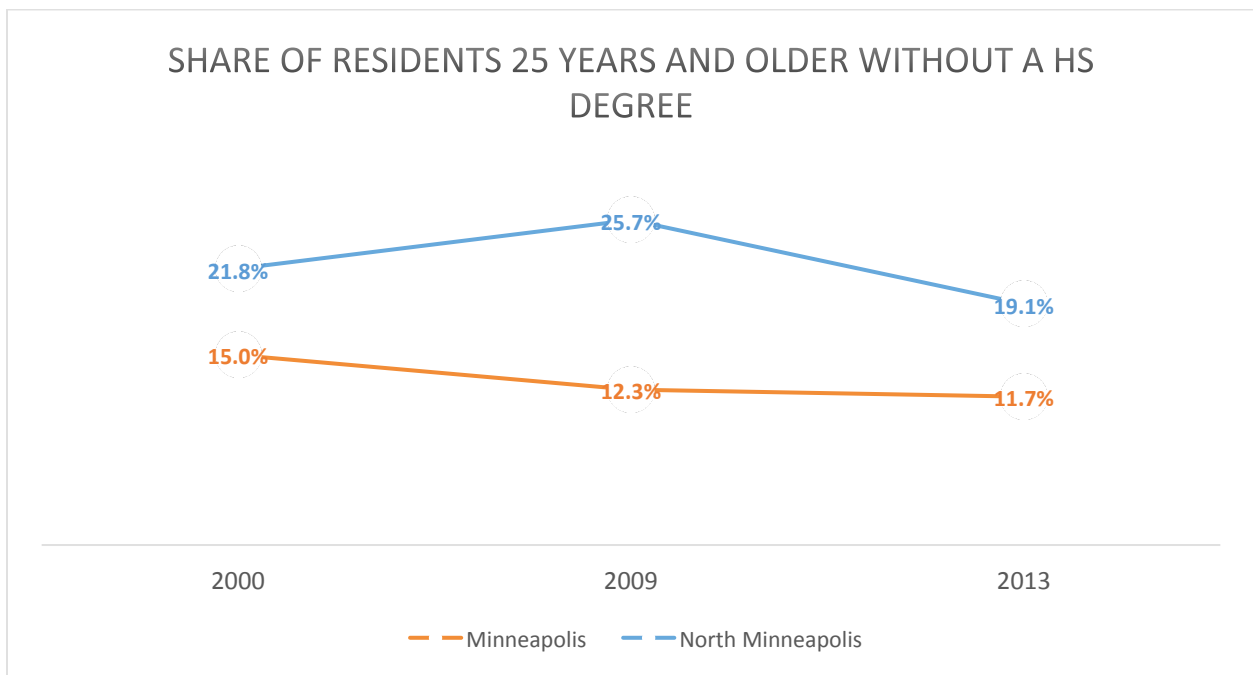




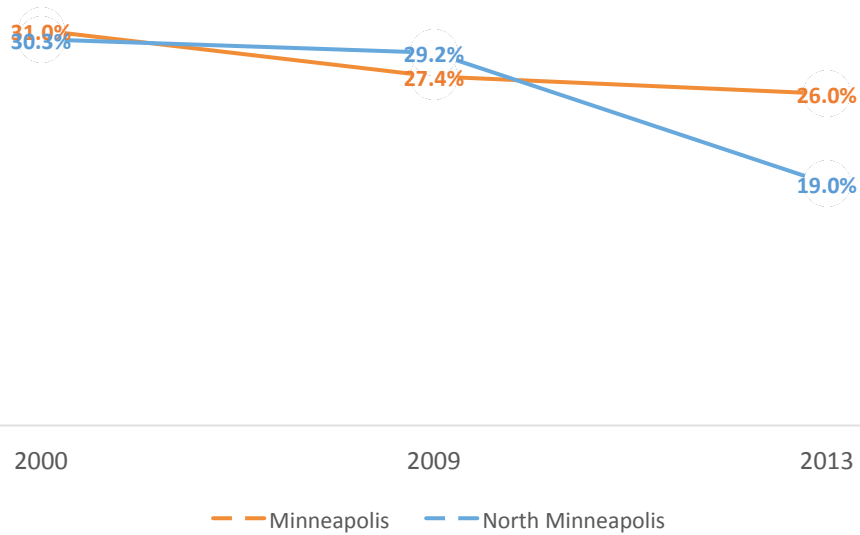

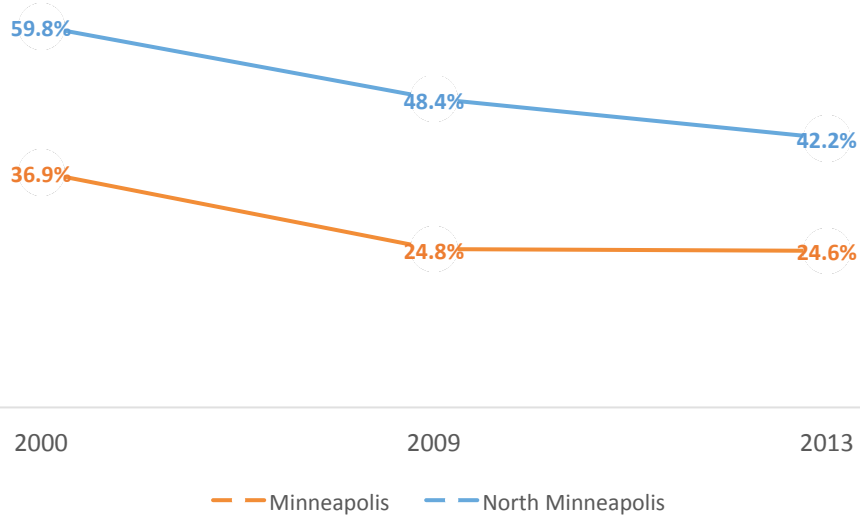

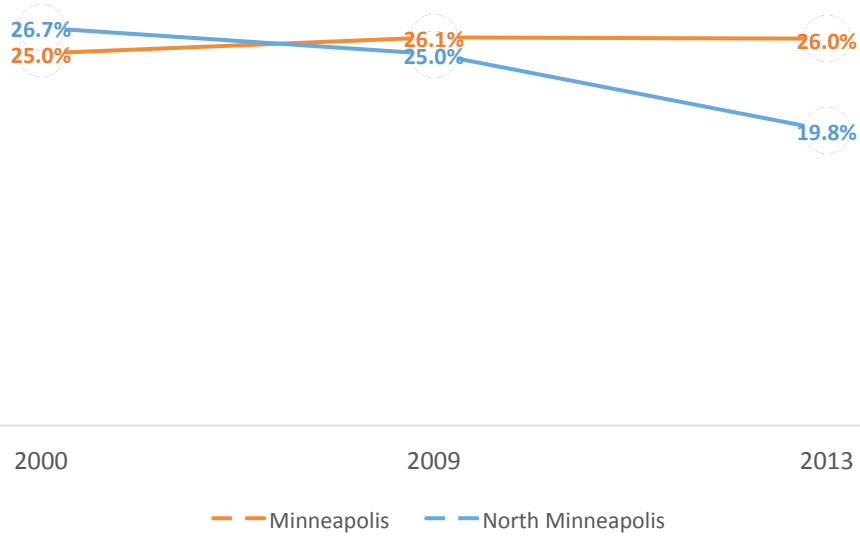
SHARE OF AMERICAN INDIAN RESIDENTS 25 YEARS AND OLDER WITHOUT A HS DEGREE



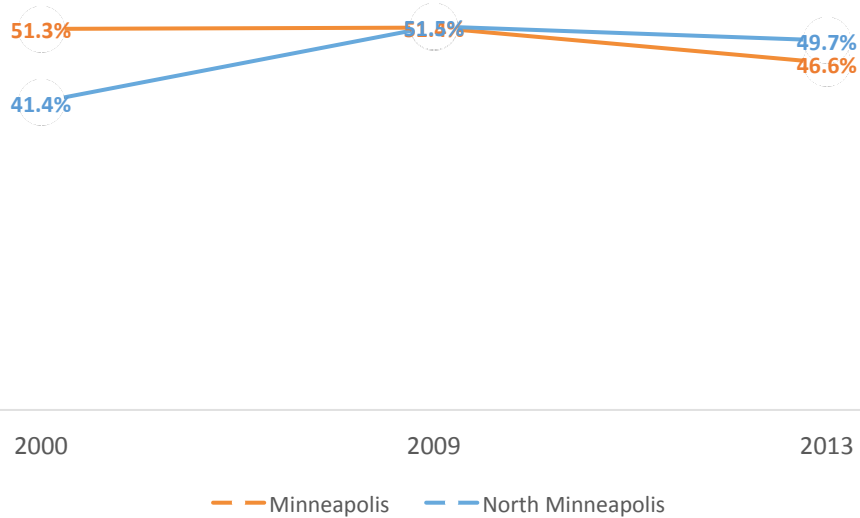
SHARE OF ASIAN RESIDENTS 25 YEARS AND OLDER WITHOUT A HS DEGREE
